## Symmer fun and follies

If there is one thing we South Floridians love, it's summer time. Whether it's lounging by the pool, taking the boat out or having a barbecue with friends, it's easy to get caught up in all that summer has to offer. But as the sunny season approaches, it's important to remember that while we are having fun in the sun, we are also taking certain precautions to ensure our pets' health and safety. With summer just around the corner, here's a list of some of the things to look out for.



#### **Beat the Heat**

One of the most obvious things to be wary of is warm weather. The combination of the Florida sun and humidity can be very dangerous for a pet. Make sure your animal always has access to clean water and don't leave your pet outside alone for more than a few minutes. If your pet exhibits signs of heatstroke such as panting, drooling, fever, vomiting, lethargy and collapse, cool the animal with water and bring your pet to the veterinarian immediately.

#### **Swimming Pools**

While a refreshing dip in the pool may help your pet to cool off, getting out of the water is challenging for most animals. Even the best swimmers can tire of treading water, so teach your dog where the swim out area is and how to safely climb out of the pool.

#### **Mosquitos**

Unfortunately, these pesky pests can also cause a number of health problems for both pets and people such as irritation, allergic reactions, anemia and even the transmission of many harmful diseases and parasites such as heartworm. It's important to keep your pet's preventative medicine up-to-date and to take steps to limit exposure to mosquitos.

Nothing says summer like a backyard cookout, but while breaking out the grill means delicious food for us, some common cookout staples can be harmful for your pets. Be careful not to let your pet eat foods like corn on the cob, chicken wings, ribs or pitted fruits. If swallowed by a pet, hard-to-digest foods like these can cause choking or even lead to intestinal blockage and abdominal pain.

#### 2023 Estimate of Taxable Values

The preliminary 2023 property values have posted on our website at web.bcpa.net. Florida Statutes require our office use January 1 as the date of assessment each year. Our office must consider changes in market conditions – up or down – when developing the Just/Market Values each year. The 2023 Just Values are based on the market data from January 1, 2023 back through January 2, 2022. If you purchased your property in 2023, your 2023 purchase price along with comparable market data from 2023 will be used in setting your property's 2024 Just Value. Our office will mail the 2023 TRIM (proposed tax) Notices to all Broward property owners in mid-August. This notice will show your property's 2023 Just Value, Assessed/Save Our Homes Value, all tax-saving exemptions you are receiving, and the proposed tax rates as set by the various taxing authorities.

#### **Quarterly Tax Payment Installment Plan**

While the Property Appraiser's Office does not set or collect taxes, our office receives many calls from residents inquiring about installment tax bills and their recently approved exemptions. Broward County's Records, Taxes & Treasury Division is responsible for the billing and collecting of property taxes.

For property owners on the 2023 installment payment plan, the first two installment payments (June 2023 and

September 2023) are based on the previous (2022) tax year. This means residents who have been approved for 2023 Homestead Exemption or other exemptions will not see these 2023 exemptions on either the June or September installment bills. The final two installment bills (December 2023 and March 2024) will be adjusted to include any 2023 exemptions or changes to the property's taxable value. The deadline to apply for Broward County's Installment Payment Plan was May 1, 2023. Should you have any questions regarding the payment of property taxes, the Tax Collector's Office can be reached at 954.831.4000 or by email to revenue@broward.org.







## FROM THE DESK OF DEAN TRANTALIS



**DEAN TRANTALIS** 

April 12 will be long remembered in Fort Lauderdale as the date when we suffered devastating flood damage from a sudden, long-lasting and incredibly strong group of thunderstorms. It should also be remembered as a date when the community came together to help each other first to be safe and then to recover.

What happened was unimaginable, but what has transpired since has been equally amazing. Neighbors helped one another, and first responders and public works staff undertook incredible rescue and recovery efforts.

City crews worked as fast as possible to clean up flooded areas, repair damage and assist those individuals who were most impacted. Our staff also worked closely with state and federal officials to obtain a federal disaster declaration so residents and businesses can obtain financial assistance. I flew to D.C. to personally lobby the Biden administration for the declaration.

I would like to thank the tireless work of our police officers, firefighters and public works crews. They worked relentlessly through the storm to keep the city as safe and help as many

stranded or trapped residents as possible. With a large part of Fort Lauderdale experiencing at least some level of flooding, neighboring communities and partner agencies came to Fort Lauderdale's aid to supplement our resources. In all, city emergency personnel responded to some 10,000 calls for service.

After the storm, the city undertook a massive cleanup effort.

At its peak, we had 36 vacuum or pump trucks working to clear flooded streets. With the American Red Cross, we provided shelter space for those left homeless. We also opened comfort stations where people could go for water, food, restrooms and showers.

As flooding receded and water removed, we turned to cleaning streets and clearing out debris. We activated the debrisremoval contracts that we have in place annually to assist following hurricanes.

The scale and scope of what happened was truly daunting.

The Weather Service estimates we were inundated with 26 inches of rain in about five hours — something that is considered a once-in-a-thousand-year occurrence. Consider these statistics from the Washington Post. The day's worth of rain equalled one-third of our normal annual rainfall.

No community is prepared for a 1-in-1,000-year storm, but Fort Lauderdale has been working for several years to make the community more resilient and ready for extreme weather.

Work has been underway to upgrade stormwater systems in low-lying areas, including those that were so devastated. This is the largest investment ever in stormwater and flood control.

We're installing more tidal-control valves and drainage pipes, building new outfall connections and drainage structures, creating new catch basins, raising seawalls, rebuilding swales and constructing stormwater reserves. As this first phase of work is in progress, the city will design stormwater improvements for neighborhoods in the second phase.

As your mayor, I take the need to improve stormwater drainage very seriously. Climate change and sea-level rise are making it ever more urgent that we also enhance our stormwater system.



The cost to make the improvements is high, but the work is necessary for Fort Lauderdale to remain a resilient community throughout the 21st century. Our neighborhoods are the cornerstone of what makes Fort Lauderdale a great place to live, and we all want to be able to live safely and securely in our homes.

Flooding Update: Since the evening of April 12, I have been in contact with FLDEM Director Kevin Guthrie and Fort Lauderdale City Manager Greg Chavarria to see what I could do to be helpful. Governor Ron DeSantis announced \$1.5 million in grant awards through the Florida Disaster Fund to support the efforts of non-profit and faith-based organizations engaged in flood recovery efforts in Southeast Florida. The State Emergency Response Team (SERT) remains in communication with areas impacted by devastating flooding, continuing to deploy state resources and assistance as requested, including one million gallons of fuel in response to fuel distribution delays caused by the flooding at Port Everglades.

Governor DeSantis has also activated the Florida Small Business Emergency Bridge Loan Program, making \$5 million available for businesses impacted by flooding in Southeast Florida. Businesses in Broward County, including sole proprietors, are eligible to apply. Florida's small business owners in need of assistance are encouraged to visit FloridaJobs.org/EBL to apply for the Florida Small Business Emergency Bridge Loan.

I am proud to say that we finally have approval of a Major Disaster Declaration from the federal government, which will provide a wide range of assistance programs for flood-impacted individuals and public infrastructure. Some of the recipients include: Team Rubicon, The Salvation Army; Southern Baptist Disaster Relief, Feeding South Florida; and Broward Long Term Recovery Group.

Legislative Update: We have concluded the 2023 Legislative Session, and we were hard at work at passing legislation that will benefit our great state. One of my top priorities this session was environmental protection and, which is why I sponsored HB 641 - Restoration of Osborne Reef. The Osborne Reef, also known as the Tire Reef, sits 1.3 miles off the coast of Fort Lauderdale. This artificial reef was created during the 1970s to address the surplus of old tires in landfills. Due to the impact of storms and currents, the bindings eventually eroded, and the tires scattered over approximately 34 acres, causing damage to nearby natural reefs. Cleanup efforts began in 2007, but as of 2019 there are still 500,000-1,000,000 tires left to be removed. Our legislation requires the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) to develop a comprehensive plan for coral reef restoration that includes provisions for the restoration of the existing reef, as well as any nearby natural reefs that were damaged by the tire installation. This project will be transformational to our underwater treasure. I must thank Senator Bryan Avila for working alongside me to get this important environmental legislation over the finish line. The bill is sent to the Governor's desk for signature to become law.

This year I also ran, HB 881 - My Safe Florida Home (MSFH) Program, which provides inspections and grants to retrofit single-family homes to make them less vulnerable to hurricane damage. The bill expands eligibility requirements to all areas in the state since hurricanes can impact any area, not just windborne areas. This expansion of the program, allows homeowners with homes valued up to \$700,000 to be eligible, increases the grant award for low-income recipients from \$5,000 to \$10,000. I also worked hard to add townhomes to this program, since thousands of Floridians were previously ineligible due to shared walls. Thankfully we were successful and they can apply. As always, it is an honor to work with CFO Patronis on another bill this session.

Unlike these good bills, I have not supported every bill that has passed. I voted against HB 833 – Vacation Rentals, which would have taken away local governments' power to regulate vacation rentals. I believe in empowering our municipalities to oversee vacation rental properties, and this bill, which I have fought against for five years, goes against the rights of our district residents. On a positive note, our district is in great shape when it comes to the appropriations that will be heading back to our district, totaling over \$10 million dollars! These projects will have a positive impact on our district in a variety of projects, including bridge repairs, water-related infrastructure, education and economic opportunity, and safety projects.

As always, it is an honor to represent you as your State Representative in Tallahassee.

## **SERVICES UPDATE**

Greetings Imperial Point Residents! As we begin the long hot days of summer, I hope that this finds you and your families doing well.

Have you ever been arrested in Broward County? Has that arrest caused you an issue with seeking employment? Are you interested in having the record sealed or expunged?

Sections 943.0585 and 943.059, Florida Statutes (F.S.), set forth criteria that must be met in order to be eligible to have a criminal history record sealed or expunged by a court. In addition, these statutes require a person who wants to petition a court to seal or expunge his/her criminal history record in Florida, to first apply to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) for a Certificate of Eligibility.

The issuance of a Certificate of Eligibility does not mean that your criminal history record will, necessarily, be ordered sealed or expunged by the court. The granting of a petition for sealing or expungement filed by a statutorily-eligible petitioner is at the sole discretion of the court.

On June 22, 2023, there will be a free sealing and expungement workshop. It is hosted by the Broward State Attorney's Office, in partnership with my office, and the Broward Sheriff's Office. The goals of the workshop are to determine eligibility for making application to the FDLE, provide on-site fingerprinting services and to provide copies of court documents needed for the application process.

The workshop will take place at the Tamarac Community Center located at 8601 W. Commercial Blvd. The hours will be 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. A government issued ID is required, parking is free and the doors close at 7:00

# Did you know the City of Fort Lauderdale prohibits fertilizing in the summer?

No one shall apply fertilizers containing nitrogen and/or phosphorus to turf and/or landscape plants during the prohibited application period (June 1st – September 30th)

## Additional information about the City's Fertilizer Ordinance



Fertilizers applied to turf and/or landscape plants shall be formulated and applied in accordance with requirements and directions as provided on the fertilizer bag.



Fertilizer shall not be applied within ten (10) feet of any pond, stream, watercourse, lake, canal, or wetland. Caution shall be used to prevent direct deposition of nutrients into the water.



Spreader deflector shields are required when fertilizing via rotary (broadcast) spreaders. Deflectors must be positioned so that fertilizer granules are deflected away from all impervious surfaces, fertilizer-free zones, and water bodies, including wetlands.



Any fertilizer applied, spilled, or deposited, either intentionally or accidentally, on any impervious surface shall be immediately and completely removed to the greatest extent practicable.



In no case shall fertilizer be washed, swept, or blown off impervious surfaces into stormwater drains, ditches, conveyances, or water bodies.



Any person who violates any provision of this ordinance shall be guilty of a noncriminal infraction. The fine structure is defined in Sec. 11-25-civil penalties.

## **BROWARD HEALTH**

What a Difference a Year Makes!

As a medical assistant in a Broward Health Physician Group pediatrician's office, Jaimee Joseph helps keep children in our community healthy.

She is a great role model for the patients and families she serves, having faced and overcome her own health challenges battling with obesity. Thanks to gastric bypass surgery just over a year ago, she's lost 90 pounds and feels like a new person.

For years before her surgery, Joseph had concerns about her weight and how it was impacting her health. She was diagnosed as pre-diabetic and before her surgery, her body mass index (BMI) was 44. BMI is a measure of body fat levels based on a height-to-weight ratio and Joseph's measure indicated she was obese.

Despite knowing that the extra weight wasn't good for her health, Joseph didn't think she was overweight enough to qualify for bariatric surgery. This is a common misperception.

Then in October 2021, Joseph began working in the office of Chi Zhang, M.D., the medical director of the bariatric program at Broward Health Imperial Point. She learned about the different bariatric procedures and heard from real patients about their experiences. She even attended support group meetings before deciding that gastric bypass surgery was the best option for her.

"God put me in this office for a reason," Joseph says. "And the impact was life-changing."

In April 2022, Dr. Zhang performed her robotic gastric bypass procedure. At the time she weighed 255 pounds, and her goal was to lose 100 of them. In one year, she is close to achieving her goal.

"Gastric bypass surgeries typically result in faster weight loss in the first year, just like Jaimee has experienced," Dr. Zhang said. "The procedure takes about 90 minutes and is followed by an overnight hospital stay. Most patients recover relatively quickly."

After surgery, Broward Health offers support group meetings and resources to patients.

"The level of post-surgical support we provide our bariatric patients really makes a difference in setting them up for success." Dr. Zhang said.

Joseph says there is an adjustment after the surgery but having that support and a positive attitude helps.

"Most people who are overweight have a problem with eating that doesn't just go away," Joseph explains. "You have to be mentally prepared that things are going to change and then find what works best for you. In the beginning, I ate small meals more frequently. Now, I eat on a more regular schedule, just not as much as I used to."

At a recent visit to the hospital, some of her former colleagues didn't recognize Joseph until she flashed her familiar smile. In addition to her dramatic weight loss, one-year post-surgery she is no longer pre-diabetic. She feels more confident about her body and -- best of all -- has more energy to be active with her kids and grandchildren.

## THE C-14 CANAL PROPERTIES HAVE FLOODING AND BOAT CLEARANCE PROBLEMS

The homeowner properties located contiguously along coastal canals in Fort Lauderdale have problems with the ever-increasing threat of high tides cascading over the old seawalls and inundating their properties with canal water. These tidal events have been increasing over the years and are predicted to continue through the 2030's, especially during the last quarter of each year when the moon's orbit is in alignment with the earth and sun to intensify the effects of sea-level rise leading to ultra-high flooding in coastal communities. They don't call Fort Lauderdale the Venice of America for nothing!

#### **Canals Cascading Over Seawalls Inundating Properties**


The City of Fort Lauderdale has been replacing their old deteriorating seawalls by increasing the height by 2 1/2 feet of elevation to stop the canal water from flooding into these waterway properties. These seawall improvement projects are slow going and are very costly along with all of the other water, wastewater and stormwater infrastructure projects that are being systematically repaired and/or replaced.

The canal waterway properties located south of the McNab Road C-14 Canal Bridge have not only been experiencing increased high tides cascading over the seawalls inundating their properties, but also have been limited to the size of their boats that are able to navigate underneath the C-14 Canal Bridge. The C-14 Canal is a navigable waterway for boats which falls under the authority of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to regulate same; however, they do not seem to have any problems with this boat safety clearance concern.

#### Pompano Beach McNab Road C-14 Canal Bridge

The City of Pompano Beach Highway and Bridge Maintenance Division has been performing bridge repairs and maintenance to their McNab Road Bridge for many years and are finally going to widen the bridge to improve both vehicular and pedestrian traffic. The City of Pompano Beach offered to heighten the bridge for larger sized boat traffic to travel underneath same for an additional cost of \$500,000 to whomever wanted to pay for this change in design. The City of Fort Lauderdale discussed this offer but voted against it since they have their own bridges to repair and maintain. A suggestion was made to those property owners located along the C-14 Canal south of the McNab Road Bridge to vote amongst themselves to fund the construction portion to heighten the bridge.

At this writing, I am unaware of any agreement being consummated between those canal homeowners and the City of Pompano Beach to fund the construction portion to heightening the McNab Road Bridge over the C-14 Canal. The City of Pompano Beach and their Engineering Division can be contacted at 954-786-4060 regarding their current status of the design completion and construction schedule for the bridge improvements.
