Pets can become one of our best friends and provide us with companionship. They may even help us with disabilities. Responsible pet ownership includes many responsibilities that should be taken into consideration when deciding to adopt a pet.

#### The Bare Necessities

Responsible pet owners provide the basic necessities of life for their pets: food, water, shelter and training.

#### **Health Care**

Health care is an important responsibility that involves keeping healthy pets healthy and making sick pets better. Feeding a nutritious diet on a regular schedule and providing clean water are fundamental to your pet's good health. It's important that your pet have adequate bathroom opportunities. That means you (or a substitute dog walker) should be available at appropriate times.

Exercise is another important part of preventive care that helps maintain a healthy body weight. Exercise is good physically and mentally. Lack of exercise can lead to obesity, and overweight dogs have more medical problems and shorter life spans than their leaner friends.

Preventive medicine also includes warding off potential health threats such as infections and parasites. Your veterinarian should immunize your pet against diseases such as Rabies, Distemper, Adenovirus, Parvovirus, Leptospirosis, Bordetella, Influenza, Leukemia, etc. and keep up with booster shots to maintain that immunity. Keeping your pet parasite-free is easy due to the many convenient forms of preventatives available. Your pet will need routine protection against heartworms, intestinal parasites, fleas, mites, and ticks. Since prevalence varies with location -- ask your veterinarian which parasites and infectious diseases pose the most risk to your pet and the best way to prevent them.

#### One of the most important aspects of responsible pet ownership is having your pet neutered or spayed. Responsible owners can do their part to control pet overpopulation by having their pet spayed or neutered.

#### Training

It is important to train your pet to keep them safe and happy. There are many programs to help you along the way. Teaching your pet the simple commands of sit and stay can be a game changer. Remember the most important thing you can do to avoid undesirable behavior is to supervise your new pet.

#### **Quality of Life**

You provide your pet with the necessities of life, good medical care, and protect them from danger. In addition to



health and safety, your pet needs love and attention. Your pet deserves a good quality of life, playing a game of tag, walking in the sunshine and snuggles next to you on the couch.

#### Preparing

A pet is a long term commitment. Hopefully he or she will be part of your family for many years. Before you commit to caring for a pet, think about your ability to fulfill these responsibilities. Carefully consider your lifestyle, family situation, and your financial situation. Pets (even "free" ones) have financial obligations which continue for the life of your pet.

Hello District 1 Neighbors!

We are currently experiencing the 2023 hurricane season, which runs from June 1st through November 30th. Water temperatures have been recorded at higher than usual numbers and NOAA is forecasting (70% certainty) that there will be 17 named storms (winds 39 mph or higher) this season. Of those storms, 5-9 are expected to become hurricanes, and 1-4 are predicted to develop into major hurricanes. Please be prepared and do not wait for a storm to develop before undertaking storm preparations to protect your family, home and yourself. Create a hurricane supply kit now. Kits may include:

- 3-5 days of nonperishable, ready to eat food
- 3-5 days of water (1 gallon per person per day)
- Battery powered flashlight
- First-Aid kit
- Reserve of prescription medications

Stay informed and receive emergency alerts from the City by signing up at www.fortlauderdale.gov/ alertftl .

Let's all stay safe and be prepared this 2023 hurricane season.

The Broward County Property Appraiser's Office mails the TRIM (proposed tax) Notices in August of each year. This is NOT a tax bill but shows your property's 2023 Just/Market Value, exemptions, and proposed taxes as set by the various taxing authorities. The TRIM Notice is your opportunity to review your 2023 Just Value and ensure you are receiving all the tax-saving exemptions you are eligible for.

Florida Statutes require our office use January 1 as the date of assessment each year. The 2023 Just Values are based on the market data from 2022 with January 1, 2023, as the date of assessment. Our office must consider changes in market conditions – up or down – when developing the Just/Market Values each year.

The Property Appraiser's Office does not set or collect property taxes. If you have questions about the proposed tax rates, the contact information and public hearing dates for the individual taxing authorities are listed to the right of each agency name on the TRIM Notice.

#### I Recently Applied for Homestead Exemption–Why Is It Not Showing on My TRIM Notice?

Florida Statutes require our office use January 1 as the date of assessment and to determine exemption eligibility each year. If you purchased your home after January 1, 2023, you are eligible for 2024 Homestead Exemption. The 2024 exemptions will show online in December and be included for the 2024 tax year.

#### I Had Homestead Exemption Last Year - Where Did My Exemptions Go This Year?

If you purchased your home in 2022, you may have "inherited" the previous owner's exemption last year. These 2022 exemptions were removed at the end of 2022, so are no longer showing on your TRIM Notice for tax year 2023. Fortunately, you can still late file for 2023 Homestead and any other exemptions you may qualify for until September 18, 2023. #### I Am a Senior Citizen – Why Isn't the Senior Exemption Showing?


The Senior Exemption is both an age and income-based exemption that is not automatically applied to a property because of the income requirement. To be eligible for this exemption, an applicant must be age 65 or older as of January 1, 2023 and have an adjusted household gross income for 2022 not exceeding \$35,167. If you believe you qualify for this additional exemption, you can still late file until September 18, 2023. To review the exemption requirements and to apply for this exemption, please go to our website at https://web.bcpa.net/bcpaclient/#/SeniorExemption

Our current police station was built some 60 years ago. It has grown woefully out of date and is in poor physical condition.

Fortunately, voters recognized the need and approved a \$100 million dollar bond in 2019. A dedicated group of neighbors and business leaders working tirelessly in a collective effort to gain the support of voters.

The new headquarters will consist of a three-story building and parking garage to better serve the needs of the community. The new facility will be built with energy and operationally efficient features such as hurricane-resistant materials.

Most importantly, the new headquarters meets modern public safety needs with updated technology and access to training. It will allow the Police Department to house an evidence warehouse and firearm training facility on site – increasing access to training opportunities and eliminating the need to pay for space elsewhere. It will also include state-of-the-art technology to monitor large-scale events and keep an eye on the city overall.

There will also be a community center for surrounding neighborhood associations and other groups to use.

We also received exciting news recently about soccer super-star Leo Messi joining our very own Inter Miami team at DRV PNK Stadium. His debut occurred in mid-July. This made it particularly important to bring some unresolved matters with the team to a conclusion.

The team has now paid the city \$1.4 million in building permit fees owed from the stadium's construction. At the same time, the city has agreed to allow fan parking on our adjacent property at least through the remainder of this season and most likely through next season. We also will work with the team to expedite the construction of additional seating because we all know that fan interest is booming.

Plans for the promised community park at DRV PNK are being crafted as we speak. Those designs will take another year to finalize before we could begin construction. Thecity and Inter Miami also are in talks to reach a conclusion about remaining differences. We look forward to Messi ending his storied career playing in Fort Lauderdale over the next couple years. Fort Lauderdale garnered international attention earlier this year when the Panthers hockey team made the Stanley Cup finals, and I'm sure Messi will put us back in the spotlight by leading Inter Miami to victory.

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

District Update: In 2022, Fort Lauderdale was named one of the best new places to start a business. There was an 89% increase in new businesses in the greater Fort Lauderdale area from 2021 to 2022. If you look at the longerterm impact from 2019, there was a 155% increase in businesses in the area. As we wait for the 2023 numbers to be released, we are expecting even better figures, and our area will continue to grow. Entrepreneurship is the lifeblood of a strong economy and community, and we are delighted to welcome them. The Broward County Public Schools (BCPS) were recognized as some of the best public school systems in America. Pompano Beach High School and McFatter were among the top 2% of schools in the nation. With five high schools in the top 5% in the nation, BCPS is certainly in a good position.

Ron DeSantis signed the new freedom budget this week which includes \$20 million for a second round of \$5000 recruitment bonuses. In addition, the budget adds \$110 million for recognition bonuses for local first responders. Lastly, the budget includes \$100 million to boost pay for Correctional and Probation officers.

Hurricane Season Update: Hurricane season is upon us, which runs from June 1st to November 1st. Make sure you know your evacuation route. To prepare for the hurricane season, monitor your local TV and radio for updates. You can also visit https://www.nhc.noaa.gov/ to stay up-to-date on the most recent positions of the storms. As always, be sure to follow the instructions of local and county officials regarding evacuation and other updates.

Beach Update: As many of you enjoy the beaches in Florida this summer, be aware of the seaweed entering the coast, as it can contain Vibrio vulnificus. When seaweed mixes with plastic, it can start to develop bacteria. Be aware of signs posted at your local beach and alerts issued by local authorities.

Legislative Update: The legislative session has ended, and we will be heading back up to Tallahassee in mid-September. On a very positive note, the budget for 2023 was released and we secured funding for all seven of our projects. There will be over \$10 million dollars allocated to fund projects in Broward County. These projects will positively impact our community, helping to repair our bridges, roadways, and other infrastructure.

Covernor DeSantis has signed into law a bill which requires the Department of Health (DOH) to contract with a community-based sickle cell disease medical treatment and research center. This center will establish and maintain a registry to track outcome measures of newborns identified as carriers of sickle cell disease. The bill requires a screening provider to notify the primary care physician of an infant who tests positive for sickle cell disease and to submit the results of the screening to the DOH for inclusion in the sickle cell registry. The bill allocates \$1,060,804 in recurring funds and \$21,355 in non-recurring funds to the DOH.

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

If you ever had a court case and needed a certified copy of a document from that file, the traditional methods were all manual. It meant a trip to the courthouse or you had to mail in a request with payment.

For some time now, my office has been offering Electronic Certified Court Documents for purchase on the Clerk's website. Each electronic certified document uses advanced encrypted features to produce a tamper proof electronic certified document that will include a unique Clerk of Court digital signature. With Electronic Certified Documents, we took steps to serve a digital society and tackle document fraud while increasing efficiency. If the case and/or document you are looking for is not available for viewing on the website, i.e., documents filed in paper form prior to 2013, you may submit a Court Records Request, or you may view or obtain court records in-person.

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

# **BROWARD HEALTH - A NEW LEASE ON LIFE**

Forty-four-year-old Laura Hennebery has worked as a teacher for more than 20 years and currently teaches health opportunities through physical education (H.O.P.E.) classes. The North Lauderdale resident is part of a close-knit family and enjoys spending time with her four sisters and her dad.

Especially now that she lost 155 pounds after bariatric surgery at Broward Health Imperial Point.

Like many people, Hennebery's weight struggles began in childhood. For years, she tried losing weight through diet and activity. Different programs worked for short periods, but she continued experiencing seasonal weight loss and gain and never made the progress she hoped for.



She reached her heaviest weight of 365 pounds after Thanksgiving in 2018. After that, she found some success with a Keto diet, losing 85 pounds in 2019, but couldn't maintain it. When the pandemic struck, she gained 50 pounds back.

Then, in 2021, she had a health scare one morning before school, experiencing extreme chest pain and difficulty breathing. While her symptoms subsided, her blood pressure was off the chart. She went to a cardiologist who, in addition to diagnosing her with acid reflux, recommended weight loss surgery. Her primary care doctor agreed.

Laura made an appointment with bariatric surgeon Chi Zhang, M.D., who put her at ease from the first moment she met him.

"I was immediately comfortable with Dr. Zhang and his office manager," Hennebery said. "They are very attentive. I felt like I was their only patient. But then when I went to their office, I realized they treated everyone the same wonderful way."

Hennebery shared everything she learned about bariatric surgery with her dad who struggled with weight gain and diabetes during COVID. They both decided to get surgery.

Hennebery had a gastric bypass surgery in July 2021.

By December 2022, she surpassed her original weight loss goal and kept going.

"I feel fantastic," she said. "I appreciate the little things like wearing the clothes I always wanted to and not worrying about bumping into people as I walk through a crowd or down the aisles of my classroom."

Her father is also doing well and feeling better after bariatric surgery. "It's been great having a partner during this journey. It's been life-changing."
