BROWARD HEALTH DECREASES MILLAGE RATE REDUCING TAX-ASSISTED REVENUES BY MORE THAN \$30 MILLION



I hope that you and your families are well and looking forward to a happy holiday season. As 2023 draws to a close, please remember that my staff and I are here to help. My office performs over 1,000 statutory duties and offers a variety of public services that are available on a daily basis.

We also have a number of community events throughout the year. One of the most impactful is the DL Clinic coming up on December 6th. If you or someone you know has a suspended driver license, this is the perfect opportunity to work towards getting driving privileges restored. Here are the details.

SUSPENDED Driver license clinic

When: Wednesday, December 6, 2023 from 8:00 am to 3:30 pm REGISTRATION IN ADVANCE IS MANDATORY.

Want to know if you qualify to have your driver license reinstated? We invite you to attend this "one stop" clinic where we will provide services to you that will help answer questions and determine if you qualify to have your driving privileges reinstated.

This event is free. However, in cases where a license was suspended due to failure to pay a citation or court costs, you will be required to pay all or a portion of outstanding delinquent fees, as well as, possibly incurring fees to reinstate your license assessed by the Florida Department of Motor Vehicles. Forms of payment accepted are cash, Visa, MasterCard, American Express, personal check, money order or cashier's check.

If your last valid ID is from before 2010 bring: 1)Proof of Legal Presence (Certified Birth Certificate, Passport, Certificate of Naturalization, Permanent Resident card, Homeland Security Immigration Documents); 2) Proof of Social Security Number (Social Security Card, W-2, Paystub); 3) Proof of Residential Address from two different documents (Bank statements, lease, bills, etc.); 4)Proof of Name Change, if applicable (Certified Marriage Certificate, Divorce Decree).

Record Sea Turtle Season

Sea turtle season runs from March 1- October 31 and this year we are happy to report that preliminary counts from the Broward County Sea Turtle Conservation Program (BCSTCP) revealed a record year. There have been an astonishing 4,328 nests documented. Even more exciting, 2023 was the first time in the history of the BCSTCP that record-breaking numbers were recorded for all three species that nest in Broward County. Among the total nests were 3,445 loggerhead, 798 green turtle and 85 leatherbacks. I believe this success is due to residents, visitors, and businesses great effort to reduce lighting impacts on our beaches and I thank you for your efforts in protecting the wildlife in our community.

All qualified Florida residents are eligible to receive a Homestead Exemption on their homes, condominiums, coop apartments, and certain mobile home lots. To qualify for Homestead Exemption, you must own and make the property your permanent residence on January 1 of the year for which you are applying for this valuable exemption. Pursuant to Florida law, all assessments and exemptions are based upon the status of the property on January 1. If you acquired the property as your permanent residence in 2023 and have not applied for Homestead Exemption, you can apply for 2024 exemptions at any time – there is no need to wait until 2024 to file your exemption application. You can easily apply online at https://web.bcpa.net/bcpaclient/#/HomesteadExemption

The timely deadline to file for all 2024 exemptions is March 1, 2024. You must make the property your permanent residence by January 1, 2024 in order to qualify; however, you have until March 1 to timely file your application with the property appraiser's office. The late filing deadline for all 2024 exemptions is September 18, 2024. For information about all the other exemptions available, please visit the "Exemptions & Classifications" page on our website https:// web.bcpa.net/bcpaclient/#/Homestead

Once approved, your Homestead Exemption automatically renews each year provided there is no change in the ownership or use of the property. If you have already applied and been approved for Homestead Exemption at your current property, you do not need to reapply for this exemption. You will receive a Homestead Exemption renewal card next month to keep for your records.

In the spirit of giving, our office recently participated in a turkey giveaway and held a food drive to benefit The Pantry of Broward County. The Pantry of Broward County is a "onestop shop" for seniors (age 60 +) struggling to live on low-fixed incomes and to help grandparents raising their grandchildren. BCPA employees donated 2,358 cans of food to The Pantry to help during the holiday season.

Hello District 1 Neighbors

I hope this message finds you in good health and looking forward to the cooler fall temperatures. I'd like to welcome our returning snowbirds back! In this newsletter, I want to address a matter of utmost importance that is affecting our community profoundly.

In response to the tragic incident at Champlain Towers South in Surfside, Senate Bill 4-D was passed to ensure the safety of properties in Florida. This legislation mandates that condo associations conduct structural integrity reserve studies every ten years. Undoubtedly, this requirement comes at a significant cost to condo owners. The bill requires associations to augment their reserves substantially, eliminating their ability to waive or reduce owner contributions. This situation is already directly impacting our community, particularly our senior residents, many of whom are retirees living on fixed incomes.

District 1 is home to many high-rise condos and co-ops, all affected by SB 4-D. For our elderly neighbors who have been a vital part of our community for years, this has resulted in substantial assessments, some as high as \$60 K. I understand the immense burden this place on our seniors, who may now find themselves contemplating relocation from the places they've called home for decades.

In light of this, I took it upon myself to introduce a resolution aimed at addressing the severe impact of this bill on our seniors. The City Commission and I will work on resolution language that urges the Florida Legislature to establish a grant or low-interest loan program specifically for full-time residents facing these substantial repair bills. It is my firm belief that the state, which created the legislation driving this issue, should step in to assist our community members. The state possesses the resources and abilities that localities like ours do not. In addition, I was able to include this as an item on our legislative agenda for our lobbyists to work on in the upcoming session.

I want to assure you all that I am steadfast in my commitment to advocating for the seniors of District 1. Their wellbeing is our priority, and I will continue to work tirelessly on their behalf. If you or someone you know is a senior impacted by SB 4-D, I encourage you to reach out to state House Representative Chip LaMarca. Together, we can make our voices heard and work towards a solution that supports our community in this challenging time.



As we usher in the autumn season, we were back in Tallahassee for a special legislative session to discuss important issues for our state. Some of the issues that we discussed included Hurricane Idalia relief, antisemitic violence in Florida, school choice scholarships for students with unique abilities, and the My Safe Florida Home program. As the sponsor of the My Safe Florida Home legislation last year, I am delighted to see that it was used by many Floridians. As a result, we are going back to replenish the funds for people who did not have the opportunity to utilize the matching grant program. There will soon be more information about the My Safe Florida Home in the coming months, and I will update you with more information as it becomes available.

I am happy to report that according to a recent study published by 'The Digital Project Manager' that Florida has been recognized as the most entrepreneurial state in the nation. Florida has the highest percentage of new businesses, with 13,238 small businesses per 100,000 residents, 3,000 more than the second-place state of Georgia. This is something that is extremely important in building strong communities and a successful economy throughout Florida.

As part of Florida's Father First initiative, Governor DeSantis announced the launch of a new statewide community network and the Father First website. Father First includes educational programs, mentorship programs, and one-onone support to encourage responsible and involved fatherhood in Florida. Through this initiative, the Department of Children and Families (DCF) has established a network of 30 community organizations to provide services to empower fathers to embrace their unique roles in their children's lives. Father First is a place for dads and future dads to find resources, encouragement and connection needed to be better every day. Through historic legislation signed in 2022, the Florida Legislature appropriated over \$68.9 million to support responsible fatherhood.

Governor DeSantis and the Florida Department of Transportation today announced that Floridians have saved more than \$300 million through the toll relief program since January 2023. In the month of July, 1.1 million customers saved more than \$38 million, and in August, 1.2 million customers saved \$39.6 million. The year-long program automatically gives frequent users with at least 35 monthly toll transactions a 50% credit to their account.

The state of Florida also recently announced the Great Outdoors Initiative which is designed to encourage Floridians to explore the state's natural resources, including our award-winning state parks, vast recreation areas, and world-renowned waterways. As part of this initiative, Governor DeSantis signed Executive Order 23-209 directing the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) to provide a 50% discount on annual state park passes and FWC Gold Sportsman hunting and fishing licenses.
