

A MESSAGE FROM SARAH LEONARDI, SCHOOL BOARD MEMBER, DISTRICT 3

Greetings, Imperial Point!

Broward Schools has unfortunately experienced another transition in leadership. Superintendent Dr. Peter Licata abruptly announced his retirement due to health reasons in April. The board moved swiftly to appoint Dr. Howard Hepburn, who was at the time serving as the deputy superintendent of academics, as the new superintendent of Broward County Public Schools. Superintendent Dr. Hepburn has gone straight to work developing a new organizational chart and changing course with the Redefining Schools initiative.

After listening to countless emails, phone calls, and comments during our public town halls, Dr. Hepburn revised the Redefining BCPS plan. Fortunately, Dr. Hepburn removed a controversial proposal to close the Montessori magnet program at Virginia Shuman Young Elementary School that I did not support. The board will still need to vote on plans to repurpose schools in June, and your involvement in this process is crucial. Your voice matters, and we value your input.

One of my top priorities is ensuring that our students and employees have safe and dignified schools to learn and work in. That's why I share facilities updates with you in each newsletter. The cafeteria at Stranahan continues to progress ahead of schedule, which is great news for our students' comfort and convenience. The dog days of Summer are upon us! I hope that this finds you and your families doing well.

Sadly, jury duty scams are on the rise in Florida. Florida's Office of the Attorney General has released a new resource that highlights how jury duty scams work and how to stay protected. Some tips to stay protected from Scams at a Glance: **Sham or Summons?** are as follows:

Understand Court Regulations

Know that courts always send jury summons through the mail and that if a Floridian misses a summons, payment will never be demanded over the phone. Fines will only be imposed for a missed summons after an individual appears in court to explain a failure to attend.

Verify Caller Identity

If a call is received from someone claiming to represent a government agency or court, ask for the caller's name, title and contact information, then hang up. Verify the identity given by searching for the agency's official phone number and contacting the court directly.

Guard Personal Information

Never provide personal or financial information over the phone, via email or text to solicitors.

Be Skeptical of Threats

Remember that legitimate court officials will not threaten to arrest or demand immediate payment over the phone for missing jury duty and payments will never be requested in the form of gift cards or money transfer apps.

As your Commissioner, it's my priority to keep you informed and empowered to protect yourselves and your loved ones.

Firstly, there have been incidents where individuals falsely claim that their iPhone is pinging inside your home, as a ruse to gain access. This is a dangerous tactic used to

exploit trust and vulnerability. If you encounter such a situation, do not hesitate to call 911 immediately and report it. Your safety is paramount, and our law enforcement authorities are here to help.

Secondly, there have been instances of stolen vehicles due to key fobs being left inside or in close proximity to the vehicle. Criminals are utilizing signal boosters to gain unauthorized access. To safeguard against this, please ensure your vehicles are always locked, and keep your key fobs securely stored inside your home. If you can lock or unlock your vehicle from where your key fob is stored, it's crucial to move it further away to prevent unauthorized access.

April marked the one-year anniversary of one of most extreme weather-related disasters to hit the city of Fort Lauderdale. On April 12, our community was inundated with more than 26 inches of rain in a mere matter of hours and the result left many neighborhoods and homes under water.

As we reflect on what occurred, what stands out to me is Fort Lauderdale's indomitable spirit to come together as a community. No city could be prepared for a storm that occurs once in a thousand years, but we worked together to recover and are acting quickly to increase our resiliency to address the world's changing climate.

In those first couple days a year ago, our police and fire personnel responded to thousands of calls and our public works crews worked around the clock. The city manager and I worked closely with federal emergency management officials to obtain disaster assistance in record time.

In the end, the federal government paid out almost \$100 million in aid – helping repair homes, reimbursing temporary lodging and replacing essential property.

Since the storm, the city has accelerated its work on upgrading the stormwater system. The fact is that segments of Fort Lauderdale long lacked needed infrastructure to protect residents and property from flooding, but we are changing that.

Work in the Edgewood neighborhood, one of the hardest hit areas, has been completed. With an investment of \$14.5 million, we have reduced the frequency, intensity and duration of flooding.

MARTY KIAR - 2024 ESTIMATE OF TAXABLE VALUES



The preliminary 2024 property values are now showing on our website at web.bcpa. net. Florida Statutes require our office use January 1 as the date of assessment each year. Our office must consider changes in market conditions – up or down – when developing the Just/Market Values each year. The 2024 Just Values are based on the market data from January 1, 2024 back through January 2, 2023 with January 1, 2024 as the date of assessment. If you purchased your property in 2024, your 2024 purchase price along with comparable market data from 2024 will be used in setting your property's 2025 Just/Market Value. Our office will mail the 2024 TRIM (proposed tax) Notices to all Broward property owners in mid-August. This notice will show your property's 2024 Just Value, Assessed/Save Our Homes Value, all tax-saving exemptions you are receiving, and the proposed tax rates as set by the various taxing authorities listed on the notice.

FAILING WATER & GRAVITY WASTEWATER PIPES REQUIRING REPAIR/REPLACEMENT

During my appointment as the Civil Engineer Member of the City of Fort Lauderdale's "Infrastructure Task Force Advisory Committee" (ITFAC), I have repeatedly voiced concerns regarding the Infiltration/Inflow (I/I) occurring in the old, deteriorating wastewater vitrified clay sanitary gravity sewers. Also, I have expressed concerns about the failures of the old, undersized tuberculated (rusting), cast iron water mains primarily occurring in the older subdivisions. Recently there was an old water main that could not be repaired and pass the required bacteriological tests required by the Health Department, much less meeting the Insurance Services Office (ISO) fire flow requirements. These older, smaller diameter-sized utility systems continue to fail, causing disruptions of service and potential health and safety concerns to the utility customers, until finally the regulatory agencies intervened requiring these older failing utility systems to be replaced by requiring larger-sized projects.

Although the City's Public Works Department was initiating utility projects using their limited Enterprise Funds to repair and/or replace these old, failing water and sanitary sewer systems on a small scale, the enormous number of these repetitious utility failures were beyond the ability of the City to be completed in a timely manner. This resulted in the regulatory agencies (i.e.: Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and Health Department) to intervene and mandate the City to replace these vintaged, failing utilities within these older developments, by contracting larger sized projects to eliminate these multiple utility pipe failures.

You will be observing these larger-scaled water main projects within the older neighborhoods to replace the older, tuberculated cast iron pipes to avoid repetitive utility failures, by replacing them with larger and better corrosion-resistant pipe material for greater water pressures and to meet fire flow requirements. Also, there will be larger-sized wastewater gravity main projects to either replace the deteriorated gravity sewers in their entirety, or interline the salvageable existing gravity wastewater mains. This new requirement is much superior to the City's previous method that was only restoring the road pavement and subgrade compacted material without fixing the damaged sewer pipe, which allowed the subgrade to be continuously removed 24/7 by the I/I, only to have to repeat this repair process again in a few years.

Hurricane Season Update: Hurricane season is upon us, which runs from June 1st to November 1st. Make sure you know your evacuation route. To prepare for the hurricane season, monitor your local TV and radio for updates. You can visit www.nhc.noaa.gov to stay current on all storm activity. As always, be sure to follow the instructions of local and county officials regarding evacuation and other updates.

The legislature brought back the sales tax holiday which includes two disaster preparedness holidays, June 1 to 14 and August 24 to September 6, families can prepare for hurricane season with items like tarps, batteries, and flashlights, sales tax free. The very popular Back-to-School Sales Tax Holiday, July 29 to August 11, families can save on pens, pencils, computers, clothing, and other school supplies. Lastly, the Tool Time Sales Tax Holiday, September 1 to 7, Floridians can save on power tools, hand tools, toolboxes, and other items. The Freedom Month Sales Tax Holiday, July 1 to 31, Florida families can purchase summer items like pool floats, fishing supplies, and outdoor equipment, in addition to admissions to museums and state parks, sales tax free!
