GASTRIC SLEEVE SURGERY CHANGES THE LIFE OF A MOTHER OF TWO



At just 25 years old, Stephany Bulnes' battle with weight following the birth of her two children led her to undergo gastric sleeve surgery at Broward Health Imperial Point, under the care of Broward Health Bariatric Surgeon Alexander Parr, M.D. Stephany's struggle with weight began after the birth of her first child, which was then made worse by her use of birth control, contributing to further weight gain. Despite trying various weight-loss methods, Stephany found herself at a crossroads.

"I didn't consider new weight loss drugs because I knew that I would likely gain back the weight, and I wanted to deal with my weight issue decisively and permanently," Stephany said. "I was really struggling. I had tried so many things, and nothing seemed to stick. When I finally decided on the gastric sleeve, it felt like a chance to turn things around."

Stephany underwent sleeve gastrectomy, also known as gastric sleeve surgery.

"This surgery was performed robotically and involves the removal of about 80% of the stomach, leaving behind a pouch about the size of a banana," said Dr. Parr. "The reduced stomach size allows patients to feel full after eating less and absorbs fewer calories, contributing to weight loss. While the surgery is safe, effective and offers proven health benefits for individuals suffering from obesity or related conditions, patients must commit to lifelong diet changes to ensure the best possible outcome."

Just 10 months post-surgery, Stephany has lost 107 pounds and now weighs 155 pounds. "I feel great," she said. "Sometimes I still look in the mirror and can't believe the changes I see. I'm still learning to identify with this new version of myself and getting positive feedback from others has really helped to keep me motivated."

Today, Stephany is busy raising her 6-year-old and 1-year-old children while working as a manicurist.

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A MESSAGE FROM SARAH LEONARDI, SCHOOL BOARD MEMBER, DISTRICT 3

Greetings, Imperial Point! Broward County Public Schools kicked off the 2024-2025 school year on a great note. Over the summer we received the news that we have now achieved an "A" rating as a district! This accomplishment is a result of the hard work of our students, families, teachers, staff, and school leaders. I am so proud of everyone who made this happen and am grateful this district is finally being recognized for its excellence after over a decade. Of the 24 schools in District 3, 17 received "A" or "B" grades, seven schools received a "C" grade, and none of our District 3 schools received grades of "D" or "F". I know we will keep this positive momentum going into the school year!

A new school year brings new rules and policies and I'll take some time here to break down two of the biggest changes – metal detectors and cell phone usage. The safety and security of our schools, students, and staff is a top priority and as a district we are constantly working to ensure our children are safe in our schools. Metal detectors will now be used to screen students at all high school entry points. The state-of-the-art system is calibrated to prevent weapons and other prohibited items from entering our schools. While there were challenges around student wait times on day one Superintendent Dr. Hepburn immediately met with high school principals and central office staff to adjust and improve the implementation process.

Regarding student cell phone use, the School Board made the responsible decision this summer to require student cell phones be turned off or placed in airplane mode during the entirety of the school day, unless authorized by a teacher or administrator for instructional purposes. The research shows that this has a profound impact on student mental health and academic performance. We are proud to join a number of school districts throughout the country in prioritizing our students' well-being in this way.

No one can look around our region and not be concerned about the amount of panhandling occurring and the number of homeless on South Florida streets. Fort Lauderdale is no exception. For years, the city has worked to deal with homelessness compassionately by identifying housing options and enhancing opportunities to help individuals overcome the underlying reasons for their situation.

It was the right thing to do. Many have turned a positive corner as a result of this approach. But today, we also know that we need to take a get-tough approach with those who put others at risk and, by their actions, weaken the fabric of our community. The rest of the City Commission and I understand the frustration of the public. That is why we are demanding aggressive action, while continuing to help those who want help. We will not allow Fort Lauderdale to follow in the footsteps of San Francisco and other metro areas and become overwhelmed by this national crisis.

Dear Imperial Point Neighbors,

The south Florida fall season is here and with these upcoming months we are hoping to gain some relief from the summer heat. These fall months are also the last few months of hurricane season which can sometimes be the height of weather activity in our surrounding waters. Therefore, please remain alert and prepared. In this article, learn about the County's Fiscal Year 2025 budget process, the grand opening of the new Supervisor of Elections building, Broward County's Transit securing federal grants and Port Everglades rank in operations performance.

Broward County Fiscal Year (FY) 2025 Budget

As you may know, every year the County Commission has the tremendous task of approving a large budget which, goes into effect on October 1st. The County Administrator's preliminary recommended budget for FY25 is approximately \$7.7 billion, this includes all tax-supported and non-tax supported funds. The General Fund portion of the budget, which supports all the county services are budgeted to be \$1.774 billion. In this budget, property taxpayers will have no change on the county-levied millage rates. Below are a couple of my priorities that have been included in this year's budget recommendation.

- Continuing support for affordable housing, \$20 million is proposed in additional funding for the Affordable Housing Trust Fund and funds to implement a pallet shelter project to assist with the growing homeless population in our community.
- Supplemental funding has been added for the newly created pilot microgrant program which kicked off in FY24 to assist eligible small businesses.
- Funding is provided for targeted areas in the Department of Human Services which include, legal assistance services, mental health service, housing assistance programs focused on seniors and families.
- Funds from the Opioid settlements will be used to support the existing pilot full-time street outreach team on a permanent basis.
- Public Safety: the County Commission continues to support public safety efforts by increasing the Broward Sheriff's budget by 7.23% for Regional Services. For the County's contract with BSO for 911 Regional Dispatch services \$6.5 million is added in FY25.

MARTY KIAR - 2024 TRIM NOTICES



LAMAR FISHER

The Broward County Property Appraiser's Office mails the TRIM (proposed tax) Notices in August of each year. This is NOT a tax bill but shows your property's 2024 Just/Market Value, exemptions, and proposed taxes as set by the various taxing authorities. The TRIM Notice is your opportunity to review your 2024 Just/Market Value and ensure you are receiving all the tax-saving exemptions you are eligible for. **Please note: the deadline to apply for all 2024 exemptions is September 18, 2024.**

Florida Statutes require our office to use January 1 as the date of assessment each year. The 2024 Just/Market Values are based on the market data from 2023. Our office must consider changes in market conditions – up or down – when developing the Just/Market Values each year.

The Property Appraiser's Office does not set or collect property taxes. If you have questions about the proposed tax rates, the contact information and public hearing dates for the individual taxing authorities are listed to the right of each agency name on your TRIM Notice.

I Recently Applied for Homestead Exemption - Why Is It Not Showing?

Florida Statutes require our office to use January 1 as the date of assessment and to determine exemption eligibility each year. If you purchased your home after January 1, 2024, you are eligible for 2025 Homestead Exemption. The 2025 exemptions will show online in December and be included for the 2025 tax year.

I Had Homestead Exemption Last Year - Where Did My Exemptions Co?

If you purchased your home in 2023, you may have "inherited" the previous owner's exemptions last year. These 2023 exemptions were removed at the end of 2023, so are no longer showing on your TRIM Notice for tax year 2024. Fortunately, you can still late file for 2024 Homestead and any other exemptions you may qualify for until September 18, 2024. To apply online, please visit our website at https://web.bcpa.net/bcpaclient/#/Homestead or scan the QR code below.

I Am a Senior Citizen – Why Isn't the Senior Exemption Showing?

The Senior Exemption is both an age and income-based exemption that is not automatically applied to a property because of the income requirement. To be eligible for this exemption, an applicant must be age 65 or older as of January 1, 2024 and have an adjusted household gross income for 2023 not exceeding \$36,614. If you believe you qualify for this additional exemption, you can still late file until September 18, 2024. Dottie Mancini Park Negotiations Update

The City of Fort Lauderdale has been meeting with Broward Health, property owner of the Dottie Mancini Park (DMP), located northwest to the Broward Health Imperial Point Hospital since DMP's closing on 1 November 2023 and subsequent lock down on 7 December 2023 after the previous city lease lapsed. The city has been meeting with Broward Health this year with the intentions to agree upon a new lease with the most recent meeting held on 8 August 2024. District 1 Commissioner John Herbst indicated during his Pre-Agenda Meeting on 19 August 2024 that a new lease agreement with Broward Health has not yet been agreed to and is not on the agenda item for the next city commission meeting on 20 August 2024. However, Commissioner Herbst indicated that city continues to meet with Broward Health to negotiate another property of comparable acreage with DMP and hopefully determine a fair and reasonable lease to reopen the DMP. We'll all have to wait and see what transpires during the upcoming month or longer in determining the disposition of the DMP reopening based upon an already protracted delay experienced since its closing.

Stormwater Drainage Improvements Scheduled for Imperial Point

A request to the city along with recent photos showing three intersections where flooding occurs on a regularly basis after light rain showers, two along NE 56th Street at NE 21st Drive and NE 22nd Avenue Street and a third intersection at NE 56th Court and NE 22nd Avenue. These intersections are low elevation areas where rainwater flows to and accumulates causing flooding problems at these intersections for both vehicular and pedestrian traffic. The city provided an update verifying these locations and have already been included for Capital Improvement projects with approved budgets issued the with following project numbers and amounts allocated in the proposed Fiscal Year 2025 CIP Budget:

Project #FY202110994 - NE 56th Street & 22nd Avenue Allocated \$783,730 in FY 2025

Project #FY20221012 - 2175 NE 56th Street Allocated \$568,551 in FY 2026

Project #FY20221016 - Imperial Point Neighborhood Allocated \$398,082 in FY 2026


