


In Loving Memory of Jeff Cole 1943-2024



ASK THE DOCTOR: HEALTHY AGING

Denise Cohen, D.O., an internal medicine specialist at Broward Health, shares her perspective on ways to be healthy every day of your life.

Q. Why is keeping up with preventive healthcare important for healthy aging? Your primary care provider is your top ally in fighting aging. Getting a head start is key to preventing disease and detecting health conditions early on when they are more easily treated. Women should keep up with their regular scheduled cancer screenings, such as Pap tests for cervical cancer (starting at 21) and mammograms for breast cancer (starting at 40), and everyone needs colonoscopies for colon cancer (starting at 45). Vaccines to prevent conditions like flu and shingles are also recommended, along with regular blood pressure, blood sugar and cholesterol screenings.

Q. How much exercise is ideal for healthy aging?

Regular exercise benefits your mental health and may also slow the aging process in your brain. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends that people get at least 150 minutes of moderate-intensity exercise weekly. Walk, bike or

even mow the lawn to get your heart rate up three to five times weekly. The CDC also recommends strength training at least twice a week. This helps to increase or maintain lean muscle mass, strengthening your bones and protecting your joints from injury. As you age, this will improve your quality of life and ability to do everyday activities.

Q. If you know you have a family history of health conditions such as heart disease, what lifestyle choices promote healthy aging?

Even though you may have a family history of conditions such as cancer, heart disease or diabetes, numerous studies have shown that people who are fitter have better outcomes if they do get sick. Additionally, if you are in better overall health, you will have a stronger immune system.

Q. What is the best diet or eating plan for healthy aging?

A heart-healthy diet, such as the Mediterranean diet, is your best bet for healthy aging. Eating less red meat, sugar and saturated fats, while having more fruits, vegetables, whole grains, lean protein and olive oil will protect your heart health and can help you maintain a healthy weight.

Q. What advice for healthy aging do you follow yourself?

Greetings Imperial Point!

I've been spending the first and second quarters visiting District 3 elementary schools. School visits allow me a different venue to hear from school staff to learn about challenges they're facing, best practices they're implementing, and potential policy solutions to problems in our system. These visits also provide me with the opportunity to connect school staff with district staff who can help them with day-to-day issues. Some common themes I heard were about the struggles of implementing FOCUS and the need for facilities improvements. These are challenges I continue to bring to the superintendent and to the board along with remedies to those challenges. I routinely heard from leadership at our schools how proud they are of the academic success our teachers fostered last year that resulted in an A rating for BCPS for the first time in over ten years. I could feel the genuine excitement at our schools around improving on those successes. I want to again congratulate:

- Oakland Park Elementary for improving from a C to a B
- Riverland Elementary for improving from a C to a B
- Stranahan High School for improving from a C to a B
- Croissant Park Elementary for improving from a C to an A
- North Andrews Gardens Elementary for improving from a C to a B
- Westwood Heights Elementary for improving from a D in 2022 to a B this year
- Stephen Foster for improving from a C to an A
- Northeast Hight School for improving from a C to a B

The board continues to review the implementation of the new cell phone policy this year. A few important aspects of the rule to note:

- o Students are allowed to use their cell phones at the direction of their teacher
- o Cell phones are required to be turned off or on airplane mode during the school day
- o Students who require academic or medical accommodations to allow for the use of
- their cell phones are entitled to those accommodations

Anecdotally, I've heard from students and parents a mix of positive feedback and some opportunities for improvement. I continue to review research on this topic as well as feedback from all stakeholders.

October 13th through 17th was National School Lunch Week and it was a pleasure to visit Floranada Elementary School to spend lunchtime with a group of 5th grade students. Balanced nutrition throughout the day contributes to student success in and out of the classroom. The Food and Nutrition Services team at BCPs does an incredible job every single day making sure our students have access to healthy meals and I could not be more grateful for the work they do. Fort Lauderdale's parks are a cornerstone of the community, offering residents and visitors a variety of recreational opportunities in beautifully maintained natural spaces. From expansive athletic fields and tranquil waterfronts to pet-friendly areas and playgrounds, the City of Fort Lauderdale continues to enhance its parks to serve the diverse needs of its population. Ongoing projects, such as upgrades to Lockhart Park and the reopening of Dottie Mancini Park, alongside updated regulations for park usage, reflect the City's commitment to providing high-quality public spaces that promote outdoor activities, environmental stewardship, and community engagement. These efforts ensure that Fort Lauderdale's parks remain vibrant, accessible, and enjoyable for everyone. Here are a quick update on what we've achieved so far.

Dottie Mancini Park Update:

In October, the City Commission approved a lease agreement between Broward Health Hospital District and the City of Fort Lauderdale for Dottie Mancini Park, lo-

cated at 6520 NE 22nd Ave, Fort Lauderdale, FL 33308. The lease has an initial term of 30 days, which automatically transitions into a month-to-month agreement with a rent of \$17,000 per month for the first year, after which it switches to a dollar a year for the remainder of the 30 year lease period. The lease will continue until either party provides a non-renewal notice 15 days before the end of any month or until the conditions for an Extended Term are met. The park officially reopened in October, with a grand-opening event planned for December.

Dear Imperial Point Neighbors,

The south Florida winter season is here, and what a wonderful time of the year! As the days get shorter and the nights become longer, I'm hopeful everyone is enjoying the weather, while taking time to enjoy the holiday season and beyond. This is a great opportunity to check in with your family, friends and neighbors, especially those who may be lonely this time of year.

Homelessness

The Board of County Commissioners recently held a workshop to discuss homelessness and provide direction to County Administration in response to Florida House Bill 1365. HB 1365 went into effect on October 1, 2024. It prohibits overnight camping or sleeping in public spaces. As I've reported before, the County takes a housing first approach to homelessness. We fund about \$26 million through our General Fund which provides for the county's shelters, permanent supportive housing, rapid rehousing and transitional housing. This funding also supports the outreach efforts which include, the street outreach team, airport and transit teams, medical respite, mobile sanitation, case management and more. Additionally, the County receives about \$18 million in grant funding that also supports the program described above.

Broward County also funds a homeless prevention services funding through the Family Success Division of about \$36 million from the General Fund. These funds assist with crisis assistance such as rent, mortgage, utilities and/or security deposits, financial capability programs, case management, eviction and foreclosure prevention and more. An additional \$32 million is received through grants for the support of the programs described above.

Conversations continue for the best path forward. Administration and the Board recently had a lengthy discussion regarding Pallet Shelter Villages and the possibility to create the first ever village in Broward County. The most difficult decision is location. After much deliberation, unfortunately the commission could not come to a consensus. I believe we should continue with our short-term goals at this moment. This includes, restoring and increasing shelter bed capacity at the North and Central Homeless Assistance Centers and the Salvation Army. The County should also continue using best practices that already exist in the continuum of care, that assist in serving the unhoused individuals and families through the existing network of services. MARTY KIAR - 2025 HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION



All qualified Florida residents are eligible to receive a Homestead Exemption on their homes, condominiums, co-op apartments, and certain mobile home lots. To qualify for Homestead Exemption, you must own and make the property your permanent residence on January 1 of the year for which you are applying for this valuable exemption. Pursuant to Florida law, all assessments and exemptions are based upon the status of the property on January 1. If you acquired the property as your permanent residence in 2024 and have not applied for Homestead Exemption, you can apply for 2025 exemptions at any time – there is no need to wait until 2025 to file your exemption application. You can easily apply online at https://web.bcpa.net/bcpaclient/#/HomesteadExemption

The timely deadline to file for all 2025 exemptions is March 3, 2025. You must make the property your permanent residence by January 1, 2025 to qualify; however, you have until March 3 to timely file your application with the our office. The late filing deadline for all 2025 exemptions is September 17, 2025.

Once approved, your Homestead Exemption automatically renews each year provided there is no change in the ownership or use of the property. If you have already applied and been approved for Homestead Exemption at your current property, you do not need to reapply for this exemption. You will receive a Homestead Exemption renewal card next month to keep for your records.

While Homestead Exemption is the most common exemption, there are additional exemptions available to qualified applicants. Here is the link the all the additional exemptions for your review: https://web.bcpa.net/bcpaclient/#/ Homestead


As usual, we had our giant slide and Little Critters petting zoo set up on the street.


