



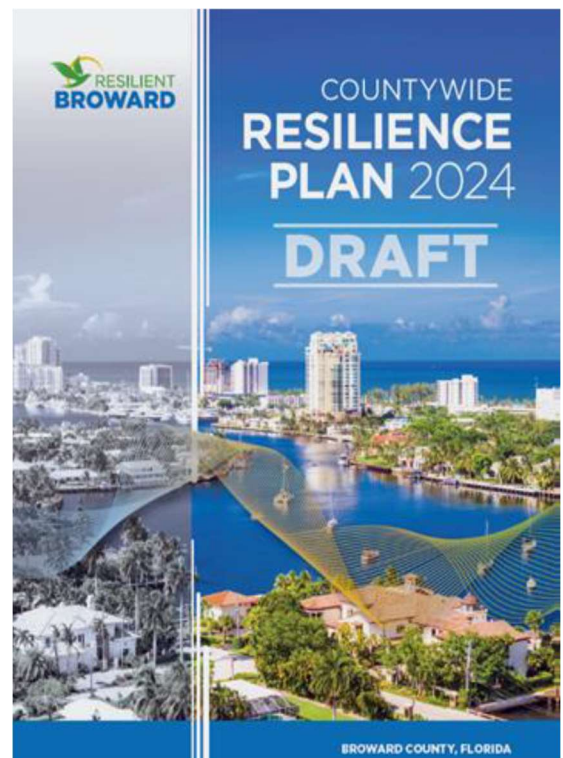

Broward County Countywide Risk Assessment

The Broward County Commission held a workshop to discuss the results of the Countywide Resilience Risk Assessment and the draft Countywide Resilience Plan. With the increased flooding events in our area, it is vital to discuss policies and investments that will protect our communities. The two-year countywide planning efforts was designed to address flood mitigation, the impacts of sea-level rise, more intense rainfall and more. The project also assessed the economic, financial risk and credit impacts that the County will face due to future conditions. Ultimately, we know that policy and specific strategies will be an important part of implementation, providing a substantial reduction in damages county-wide. Proposed strategies deliver \$8 to \$30 Billion in residential property value preservation, avoid up to \$4 Billion in asset damages, and preserve \$20 Billion in flood insurance coverage, with an 83% reduction in damages county-wide. Some investments will happen organically, others will be more deliberate, but policy and

Solid Waste in Broward County

Broward County has the chance to make a major change in the way we handle trash today and for many years to come. These decisions may shape the future landscape in Broward County, both in an environmental aspect as well as how future generations think about trash. As many of you may know, a newly created entity, The Solid Waste Disposal and Recyclable Materials Processing Authority of Broward County (Broward SWA) which was created by an interlocal agreement signed by the County and 28 cities, is in full motion to develop a countywide masterplan for the future of trash. This

40-year plan will provide detailed operation and facility recommendations for a solid waste and recycling system that is transparent, innovative, economically efficient and equitable, and environmentally sustainable. Ridesharing changes at FLL



Broward County's Aviation Department has made the decision to relocate the Ride Share/Transportation Network Companies (TNC) passenger pick up location from the previous open air TNC pickup site between two terminals at Ground Transportation Area 3 to a redesigned location between Terminal 3 and 4 inside the Palm Garage. Recent data shows that on some

days, FLL has more TNC passenger pick-ups than the number of parking spaces (11,000-plus) available in the airport's garages. At certain peak times, the GTA-3 location has handled more than 350 TNC operations per hour! The previous site was weather prone and had frequent traffic jams. The new location is more spacious, covered and provides an efficient option for TNC's and will provide more customer experience enhancements for our residents and visitors. Animal Care – Tags for Life Program

Broward County's Animal Care Division recently launched an innovative Tags for Life program, which simplifies the pet registration process for residents. All dogs and cats in Broward County must have a county registration tag and a current rabies vaccination to comply with local laws. The Tags for Life program prioritizes convenience, eliminating the need to track and replace tags annually while maintaining protection and legal compliance with the annual renewal of their Tags for Life registration.
